TAKEN PARTLY FROM CODIFIED ORDINANCE 963

DEFINITION: Street trees (or Tree Lawn Trees) means trees, shrubs, and all other woody vegetation on land lying between property lines on either side of all streets, avenues, or ways within the City. Generally this is the area between the sidewalk and curb on a typical street.

TREE CARE: The City shall have the right and responsibility, at its cost, to plant, prune, maintain and remove trees, stumps, plants and shrubs within the right of way of all streets, alleys, avenues, lanes, squares and public grounds, as may be necessary to insure public safety or to preserve or enhance the symmetry and beauty of such public grounds.

The City Tree Commission may recommend to the City Manager the removal from the right of way of any tree or part thereof which is an unsafe condition or which, by reason of its nature, is injurious to sewers, electric power lines, gas lines, water lines or other public improvements, or is affected with any injurious disease, insect or other pest.

PROXIMITY: No street tree shall be planted closer from any street corner, measured from the point of nearest intersecting curbs or curb lines, than twenty-five feet. No street tree shall be planted closer than ten feet from any fire hydrant. No street trees, other than those species referred to as small trees in Section [963.07](#) may be planted under or within ten lateral feet of any overhead utility wire or over or within five lateral feet of any underground water line, sewer line or other utility.
